- 1. Working together can have advantages in terms of knowledge compared to working individually.
- 2. The experiment done on the 40 kids showed that working together, they were able to pick up and turn the reel quickly, but if one child had not done it, it would have taken longer for him to do it by himself.
- 3. When working together, not all people in the group will put the same amount of effort into it because other people are all working for the exact cause.
- 4. One thing I found noteworthy about the common knowledge effect is that when working in a group, there are going to be people who have more significant knowledge than others, making it harder for the group to be on the same page. Even though it can be a struggle, it can help open ideas quickly for the group.
