- 1. Ethnography is a type of research where you get involved with a community, write what they do, and interact in their environment to better understand your research in their communities.
- 2. When researching the term ethnography, it can be hard to find a place that welcomes your research since you will get involved in their communities or groups.
- 3. I learned from chapter 3 in the book that if you're going to do research where the people or community have been frequently questioning, try to offer something in return for their participation when helping with your research as participants.
- 4. On page 26, building an understanding or conversation with the participant can help you get closer to groups of people in a community that weren't that welcoming to your research, but can later change.
- 5. One of the things that opened my understanding of Ethnography from the chapter was that people who research other communities have a life-changing impact on their lives. They better understand what a particular community is going through that isn't being discussed.
