1. What was most interesting to you in reviewing these resources?

How she explains that things changed, it's not just about if someone asked what can I do now to change the climate for the better, it's too late for that at this point, it's just trying to not make it worse. There is more interaction and interest in the young generations for climate change and the environment.

2. What did you learn from these resources about ocean conservation?

There wasn't much information about ocean conservation. Still, some of the things they talked about in short were that ocean conservation involves many parties, including policies, the economy, and culture, and how to change those and make a big difference in the preservation of different life in the ocean.

3. What new questions do you have after reviewing these resources?

Is there a possibility of us fixing some of the environmental issues we have caused, not just stopping them from getting worse, and can it go back to how it was?

4. What do these resources tell you about the types of people that do science?

These resources tell me that science has a passion for creating and for bringing about change for the better good of all. But they face difficulties due to a lack of attention from the general public, making their need for change hard to gain attention. Going back to when people started to see and be affected by the bad change in the environment, and now they want to give their attention to these scientists.
